

English

This term we will be focusing on the Dickens classic, Oliver Twist, as part of our topic of the Victorians. This will be continued after half term as we delve into the haunting tale of A Christmas Carol. We will also be reading War Games by Michael Foreman to link to Remembrance Day, this is a story based on the real life game of football on no mans land on Christmas Day during World War 1.

As we read these texts we will be writing in a wide variety of genres, adapting our skills learnt each time.

Our 'non negotiables' for writing in Year 5 (things we expect your child to include in each piece of writing without reminding) will be shared with your children in our first week, they are: capital letters to mark the beginning of sentences and proper nouns, to end sentences with a form of punctuation (at least a full stop, question mark or explanation mark), to consistently use past/present tense, to use conjunctions in a range of sentence types. These are all things they have shown they are able to do in previous years.

Mathematics

This term children will begin their Numeracy work looking at the place value of numbers up to and beyond 1 million. We will be looking at mental calculations for each of the four operations and then using this to solve written formal methods. They will also be using these skills to solve application and reasoning questions.

In geometry, we will be looking at classifying and identifying 2D and 3D shapes, and looking at reflecting and tessellating these. We will also be revising co-ordinates.

We will be further developing our knowledge of fractions and percentages and converting or finding equivalences between these, beginning with tenths.

Science

In Science in Autumn term we will be looking at Properties and Changes of Materials. We will be identifying how a solution is formed via dissolving and how to recover the solid from the solution. We will also be identifying reversible and irreversible change through enquiries. During our Science lessons, we will be improving our Working Scientifically knowledge of enquiry and investigation, including identifying and changing variables in fair tests.

History:

We will be focusing on the Victorians this term, looking at key events in the Victorian era, the life of rich and poor Victorians and researching using different sources to find further information about the industry and changes of this time.

Geography:

We will use our map skills to compare the changes of leadership from the British Empire of the Victorian times to the Commonwealth of today.

D&T /Art/Music:

In Art we will be focusing on the famous Victorian artist, William Morris. We will be looking at some of his most famous pieces in real life during our trip to Wightwick Manor.

In Music we will be appraising and performing 'Food Glorious Food' from the musical version of Oliver Twist.

French:

This term we will be reviewing counting up to 60 *en francias*. We will also be revising the days of the week, months of the year - both conversing and writing using these.

Computing:

In computing this term we will be using a range of software to input, edit and use sound to program, we will also be using sound to add effects to the performances of our writing.

RE:

We will be looking at how different faiths pray and will be comparing the prayer of the Muslim, Jewish and Hindu faiths.

P.E./Games

We will begin the term by looking at Cheerleading in our Dance lessons, learning new skills and performing. After half term we will be learning new football skills to play games, including a reenactment of the famous WW1 Christmas day match to acknowledge Remembrance Day.

PSHE:

We will be looking at our new beginnings in Year 5—our rules and responsibilities in our new year group.

We will also be looking at our personal safety, including how to stay safe when online.
