### Children In Need 2020...

At Perry Hall this year, we have been working hard to raise money for Children In Need and we have raised a brilliant total of **£366.97**. Children throughout school have been taking part in a variety of activities this year— **well done to all our children!**

Our younger children have had lots of fun celebrating Children In Need by dressing up, sticking different materials on our Pudsey bears, and joining in with lots of action songs.

Further up the school the children have read the story: Pudsey's Great Fundraiser. They have learnt what Children in Need is for and how money can be raised. During the day, lots of different activities took place, such as, cutting out Pudsey and Blush clothes and dressing them, ordering Pudsey numbers, drawing pictures of Pudsey and Blush and then writing some initial sounds, simple words and short sentences about the characters.

Moving into Key Stage 2, children kicked off this year's Children In Need by joining in with Joe Wicks' and worked up quite a sweat - teachers included! There were whole class discussions about the importance of the event and how the charity helped the most vulnerable children and families in our society. Children created their own Pudsey headbands and completed a fun maths activity too.

Furthermore, our children had great fun and shared the last 30 minutes of Joe Wicks' phenomenal effort of a 24 hour PE session as well as completing poster work and reflecting upon Children in Need videos and extracts. Our pupils were incredibly mature and thoughtful when discussing the matter and displayed a fantastic attitude towards their own reflections and their learning.

### Diwali 2020...

At Perry Hall, children have been learning about the story of Rama and Sita and how Diwali the 'festival of light' is celebrated by Hindus and Sikhs around the world. Staff taught this topic in an age appropriate way from Nursery through to Year 6.

Each year group spent the morning creating vibrant mendhi patterns, rangoli patterns, divas and lanterns using a range of Art techniques. Children in Year 6 retold the story of Rama and Sita through their own creative interpretations of the classic tale. Working in small groups, the children directed their own plays and performed the story to their peers.

In addition to this, children also enjoyed a special lunch time menu where traditional Indian food of onion bhajis, samosas, chicken tikka and chicken korma was served. The morning was greatly enjoyed by all of the children.

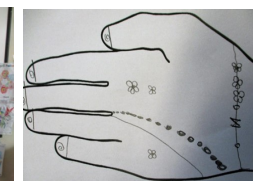

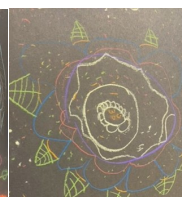
