# HOW WE KEEP YOU SAFE AT PERRY HALL PRIMARY SCHOOL

The law says that all children should be safe all of the time, including at school, and we want that to be true all of the time. It is the job of your teachers and parents to make sure this happens.

Teachers and adults in school have a safeguarding policy which they follow all of the time, this is a smaller version of that to help you understand how we keep you safe.



At Perry Hall, we try hard to always act in the best interests of you. We do our best to help and support all of our children and their families by making sure that anybody can ask us for help at any time, and that your teachers will know what to do to help.

We have rules to follow if we believe someone is not safe. We work together to protect them. We may ask other professionals to help protect that person too.

The rules we follow mean that all the adults who work in our school are safe to work here and if someone behaves in an unsafe way with our children then we can remove them from our school.




Our lessons tell you how to keep yourself safe, to know what is unsafe and what it means to give consent. We teach you what you should do if you feel unsafe, in person and online. We teach you that you are responsible for the comments you make online or in person and that these can have consequences.

Your mental health and how you are feeling are very important to our staff at Perry Hall. Your teachers work with you to help you know what you are feeling and how to manage how you are feeling, giving you all the tools to manage your feelings if your emotions become too much



## Is someone bullying you?

You must tell someone at school so we can help you.







#### Has someone said something unkind to you?

Has someone said something to you or have your heard someone talking about you that you do not like or has upset you?

You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

#### Has someone touched you?

Has someone touched a part of your body that made you feel uncomfortable?

You must tell someone at school so we can help you.





# Has someone tried to give you something you should not have?




Has someone asked you to take a tablet, smoke a cigarette or have a drink of something that you don't know what is in it?

### DO NOT EAT, DRINK OR SMOKE WHAT THEY HAVE OFFERED YOU.

You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Has someone hit, punched, smacked, kicked or hurt you any other way, on purpose, with physical contact? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.







Has someone sent you something that has made you reel uncomfortable?

Has someone sent you an image or message through the internet, your phone or online game? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

DO NOT KEEP IT A SECRET.

There are many staff at school for you to talk to and they will help and support you.

It is everyone's responsibility to keep you safe, but these people are here for your teachers to come to if they are worried about your safety.



If you need help, ask any teacher or any of the staff above.

They are here to help, not judge.
